Seeking Candidates for One Water System Foreman & One Water System Operator

The Rio Linda Elverta Community Water District

The towns of Rio Linda and Elverta are situated in the Northwest corner of Sacramento County in the central valley of California. The towns are in a rural bedroom community located 15 minutes from downtown Sacramento. Lake Tahoe and San Francisco are both 90-minutes away from this centrally located community. The District provides drinking water via a dozen wells and is currently designing a treatment facility to remove hexavalent chromium in the groundwater.

The Positions

These positions work under the general supervision of the Water System Manager who reviews work for conformance to established standards and procedures. Supervision ordinarily is not a responsibility of the Water System Operator. Supervision is an occasional requirement for the Water System Foreman.

Typical Tasks

The District needs personnel who can use a variety of construction tools, equipment, and machinery; ability to perform routine maintenance of light vehicles; ability to work harmoniously with other employees; ability to use tact and judgement when dealing with the (CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE)

public: ability to lift heavy objects and perform sustained manual work.

Operates the treatment facility, which is currently being designed to remove Hexavalent Chromium via ion exchange. Assists with maintenance and operation of the District's water system; makes necessary tests for water quality and adjusts chemical systems. Performs required labor involved in construction and maintenance projects as part of a crew, including pavement cutting, trenching, main and pipe repair, laying pipe and backfilling. Performs routine water quality testing; gathers information for reports needed for regulatory agencies. Installs and maintains pumps, valves, mains, services, meters, and related water distribution facilities and appurtenances. Operates and performs regular maintenance on equipment used in water systems including vehicles, pumps, vacuum trailer, backhoe, dump truck and other equipment. Reads water meters; turns services off and on; meets with customers to identify service locations and resolves service problems. Performs on call and emergency work assignments.
